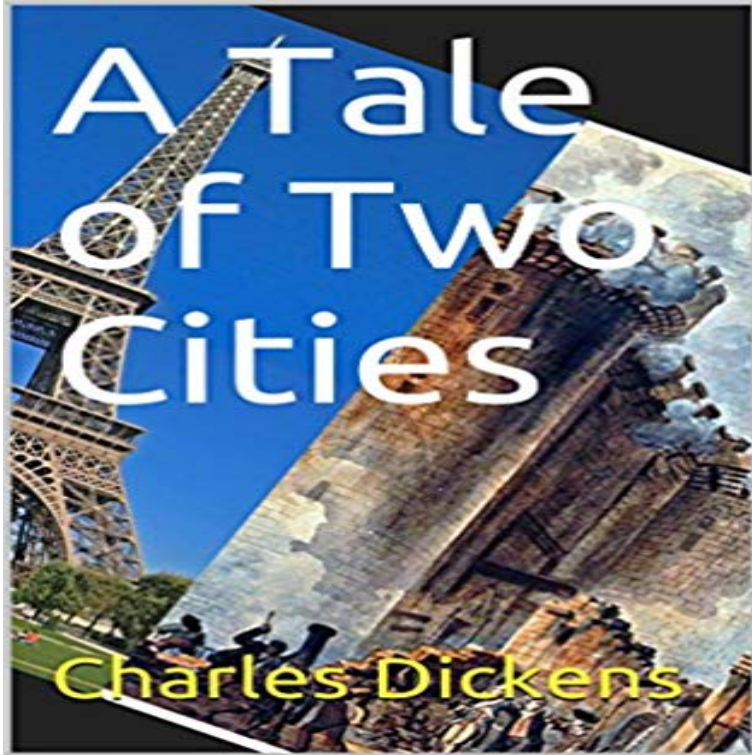


A Tale of Two Cities: with additional information on French revolution + illustrations of important events during French revolution
