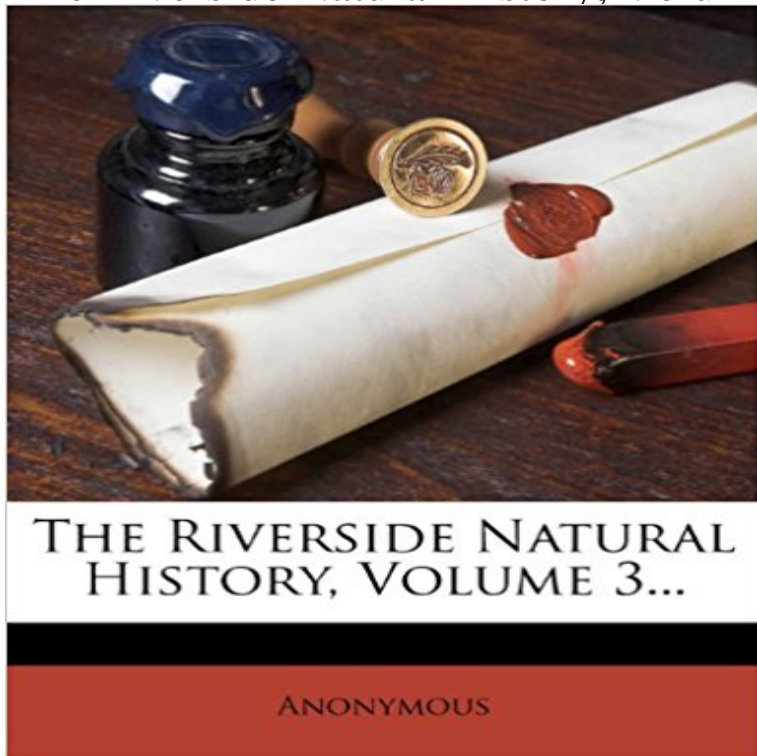


# The Riverside Natural History, Volume 3...
