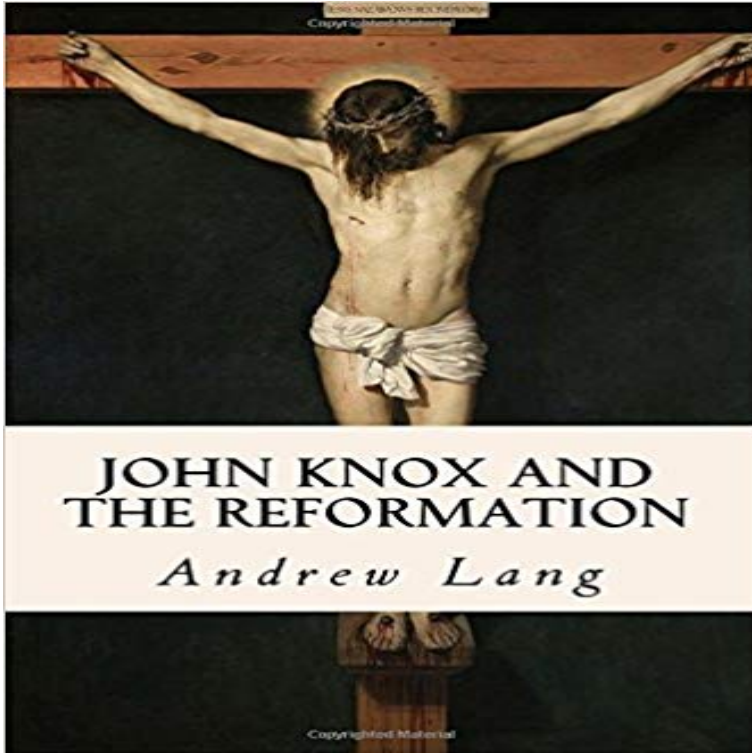


John Knox and the Reformation
