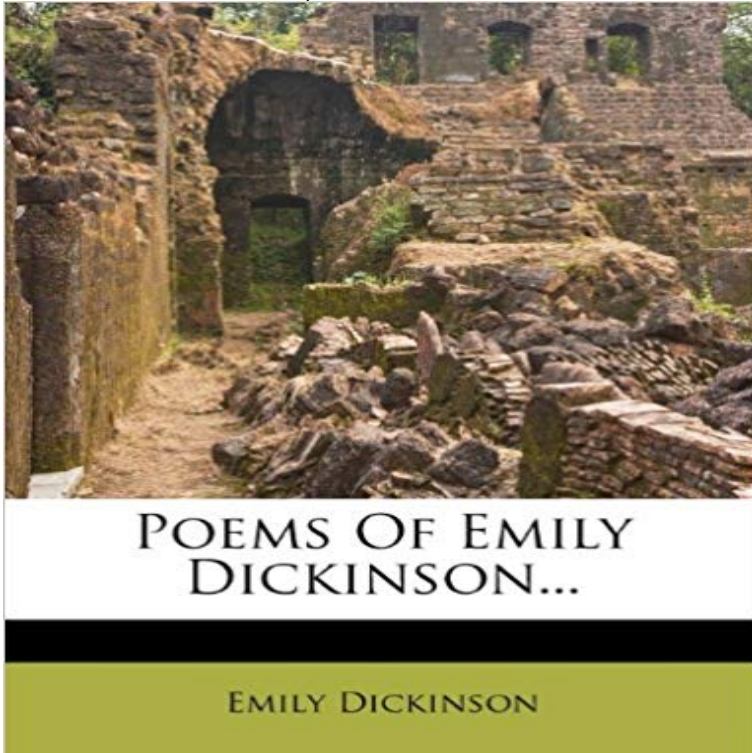


Poems of Emily Dickinson...
