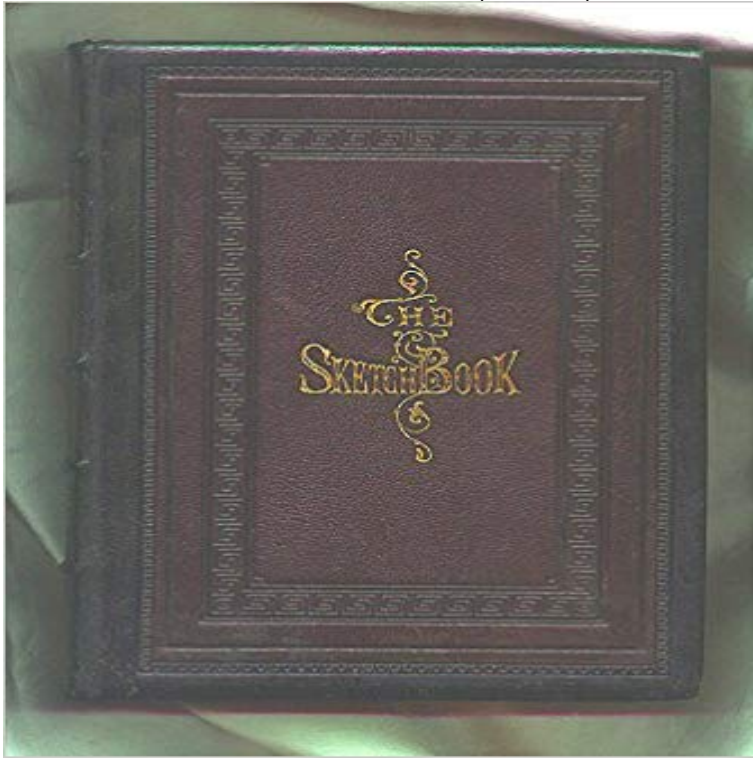


## Sketch Book of Geoffrey Crayon



Washington Irving's writings in this book include: The Authors Account of Himself; The Voyage; Roscoe; The Wife; Rip Van Winkle; English Writers on America; Rural Life in England; The Broken Heart, The Art of Book Making; A Royal Poet; The Country Church; The Widow and her Son; A Sunday in London, The Boars Head Tavern; The Mutability of Literature; Rural Funerals; The Inn Kitchen; The Spectre Bridegroom, Westminster Abbey, Christmas, The Stage-Coach, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, The Christmas Dinner, London Antiques, Little Britain, Stratford-on-Avon, Traits of Indian Character, Philip of Pokanoket, John Bull, The Pride of the Village, The Angler, The Legend of Sleepy Hollow, L'Envoy.

Included are an engraved halftitle, engraved title, letterpress title, publishers note, preface and an appendix. The copyright page states the copyright dates of 1863, with no other date listed. The illustrations are from original designs, engraved on wood by Richardson, presumably Frederick Richardson. These engravings are after numerous prominent artists, including William Hart, Parson, F. O. C. Darley, Hoppin, F. A. Chapman, Edwin White, who are identified in the index. Illustrations include: Abbotsford, Coast of Wales, The Catskills / Catskill Mountains, Catskill Lake, Hudson River Valley, characters from the writings, etc. Plus there is a portrait of Washington Irving, after Stuart Newton, engraved by Hall. Washington Irving (1783-1859) is often thought of as the Father of American Literature. He is considered the first successful professional writer in America. He was one of the first American writers to receive acclaim from British critics. He is best remembered for his all-American tales The Legend of Sleepy Hollow, and Rip Van Winkle, which are presented here. Irving first published these Hudson Valley stories in 1819, in his Sketch Book, using

the pseudonym Geoffrey Crayon.
