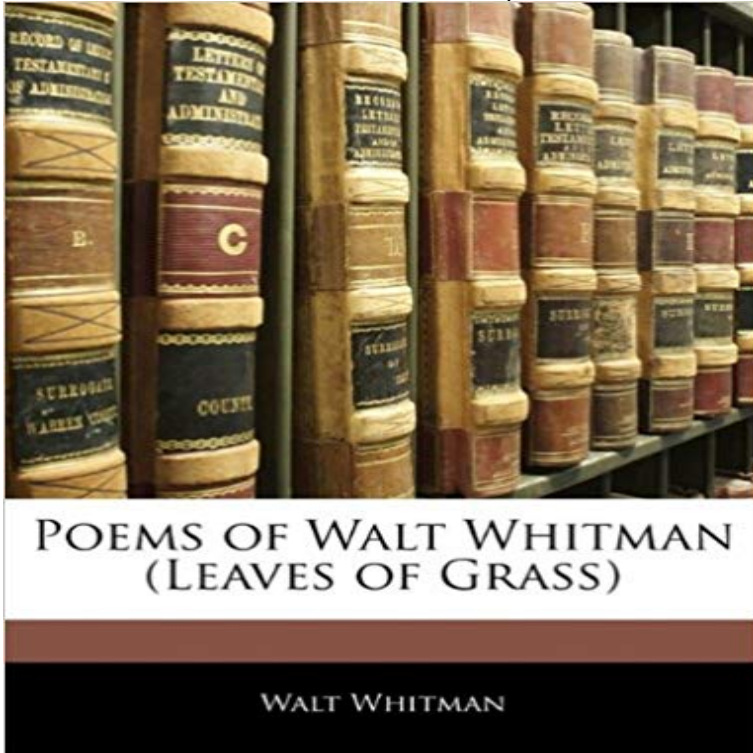


Poems of Walt Whitman (Leaves of Grass)
