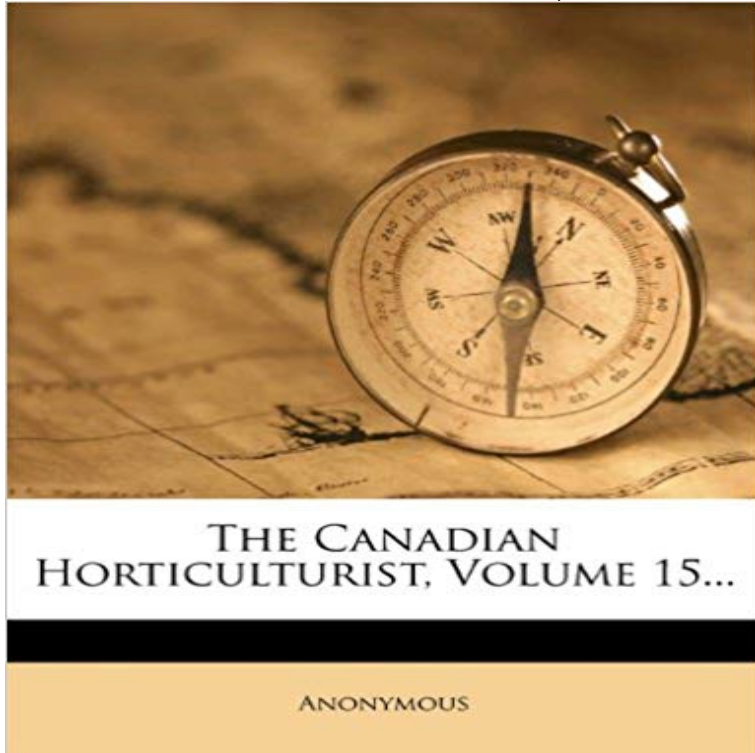


# The Canadian Horticulturist, Volume 15...
