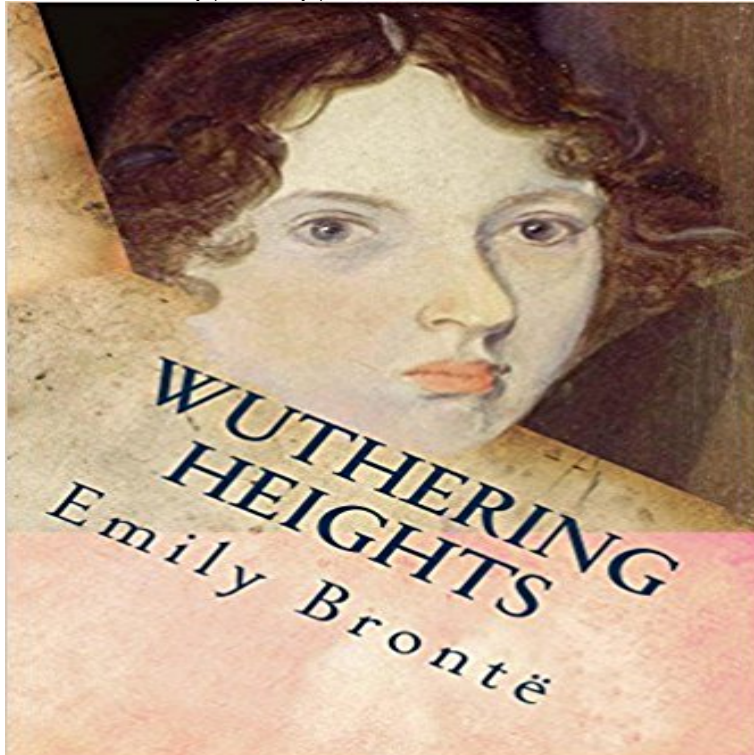


Wuthering Heights



Mr Earnshaw has two children, a son, Hindley, and a daughter, Catherine. One day he returned from a trip with an abandoned child aged six, Heathcliff, a young bohemian, no doubt. Hindley early entry into conflict with Heathcliff and the death of their father, becomes the master of the house. Heathcliff is treated more harshly than ever. But Catherine and Heathcliff love tenderly and childish feelings become even deeper in adolescence. They frequently escape into the moor to dream of better days. Hindley married Frances. Unfortunately, his wife died three months after the birth of their son, Hareton. Hindley is mad with grief, began to drink and becomes even more embittered. Catherine decides to marry a rich heir, Edgar Linton, convinced that he will accept Heathcliff as a brother to evade the wrath of Hindley. And especially to satisfy his pride to be part of the richest family in the country. Heathcliff but does not include the operation of Catherine and fled, wounded by this wedding announcement. His departure makes Catherine very unhappy. Shortly after the marriage of Catherine, Heathcliff returns. It ruins the game and Hindley comes into possession of Wuthering Heights. Catherine and Heathcliff spend time together as before. But his return, the frequent confrontations between her husband and him, and the fact that he starts to seduce the sister of Edgar, Isabella, fell in love with him, make Catherine falls seriously ill. One evening in which Heathcliff access to the house was forbidden, manages to meet Catherine, who is dying, and they both say they have always loved. A few hours later, Catherine dies after giving birth to a daughter, Catherine, called Cathy, daughter of Edgar. Heathcliff, desperate to avenge diabolically Edgar and Hindley. born a son, Linton Heathcliff. Sixteen years later, Edgar Linton dies, leaving his daughter Catherine sole heiress. Heathcliff then causes falls in love with Cathy Linton. It draws to Wuthering Heights, holds her prisoner and forced to marry Linton under threat. Linton is weak and obnoxious but dies soon, unfortunately too late for Cathy that Heathcliff has appropriated the property. Cathy and Hindleys son, Hareton, forge a love that Heathcliff has raised it in order to make a boor relationship. Hareton did not take long to protect against Cathy physical and moral violence Heathcliff. Moreover, the fact that the two cousins are very similar to their aunt and mother makes Catherine Heathcliff unable to pursue his revenge. It is increasingly strangely, locks herself in her room, refuses to eat and eventually die. In 1802, Cathy and Hareton are about to marry.
